As part of this I have been advised that there will be engagement with local Parish Councils. For further details speak to KCC planning Team 09/12/2022 – KCC have emailed APC to offer a meeting to engage with them on the bidding process for DfT funding for improvements to the Major Road Network in Thanet, including Columbus Avenue.

Narrowing of Crispe Road entrance, signs prohibiting traffic except for access, which could be achieved by extending Columbus Avenue and redirecting traffic.	02/02/22 Any adjustments will need to ensure that permitted vehicles such as agricultural vehicles, deliveries, service vehicles and emergency services can still use the road when required. The roads are already covered by a 7.5t weight limit to restrict larger unsuitable vehicles. We do not install prohibitions of motor vehicles in narrow lanes – there are many narrow single-track roads in the County and it is not practical to place restrictions of vehicles on them all.
